Term of Apprenticeship: 2,000 hours (1 year) on-the-job training and 144 hours of paid on-site related instruction.

Credentials Earned: Upon successful completion of the registered apprenticeship program, apprentices will earn the Machine Operator Certificate and a Nationally Recognized Industry Credential.

- Outlines the terms of apprenticeship
- Includes agreed upon wage increases 16.50-18.00/hr
- With a possibility for higher wages with experience
- Includes contact information for resolving issues and/or complaints
